The January meeting will take place on 1/11/11 at 7 P.M. at Wood Artistry LLC, the address of which is 408 Moore Lane in Healdsburg. (Former site of Luthiers Mercantile.)

This is the shop of Don Naples, a long-time SCWA member. Don produces high end speakers, and will discuss the engineering and construction of these speakers that stand nearly four feet high. These speakers, which carry the Orion label and were designed by Siegfried Linkwitz, are rated very highly by audio critics. He also will discuss other cabinet designs used for speakers, show the differences, and explain the difference in sound. Don also manufactures and sells Lap Sharp machines and markets a variety of hand tools. Chairs are in short supply, so if you would like a seat, consider bringing one of your own.

The challenge is for a team of four to build a small wooden boat in three hours using non-powered tools (with the exception of battery-powered drills/drivers). The boat is basically made from two sheets of 3/8th x 4 x 8 plywood, 12 pieces of 1 x 2 x 8 ft. lumber and a box of deck screws. I am very interested in forming a team of SCWA members. 
